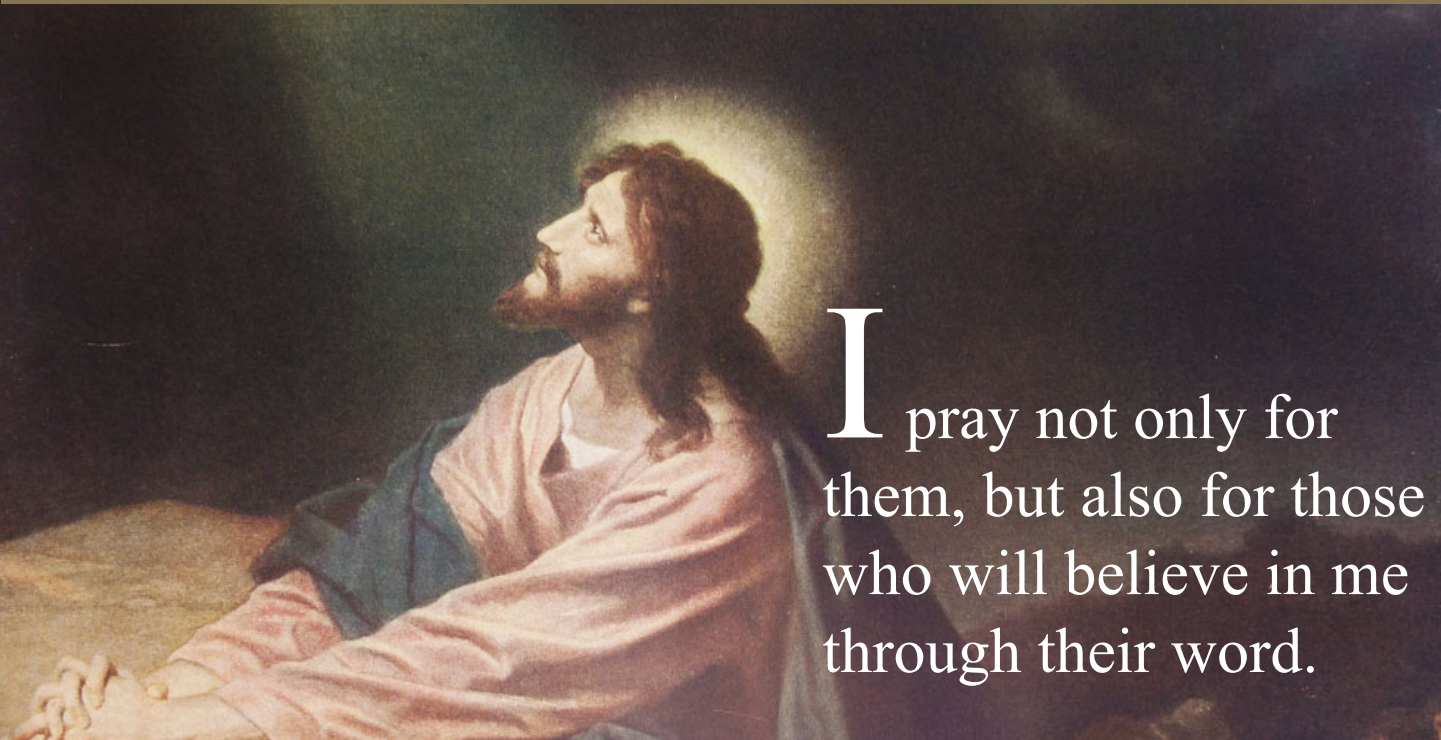

Thoughts from the Second Floor Front

VII Sunday of Easter

June 2, 2019

If I had to come up with a title for this week's column it would be this: All Things Change. With the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles the tranquility and Edenic harmony of the early Church is shattered by the stoning of St. Stephen, the proto martyr. This marked a turning point in the development and expansion of the Church. Things change and often things change in ways we cannot anticipate let alone control. What was, up to this point in the Church's existence, a small band of Jewish men and women who were disciples of Jesus suddenly and irrevocably shifts and moves beyond the walled city of Jerusalem. Forced into other venues, the original believers had to decide what to do. Ironically, this violent action enabled the word and The Word to spread. The next verse in the beginning of chapter 6 is:

On that day, there broke out a severe persecution of the church in Jerusalem, and all were scattered throughout the countryside of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles.

I imagine that those first disciples who moved beyond Jerusalem did so with great temerity. After all, their leader had been violently killed, the one that had been chosen to serve the community had been violently killed and now the entire church suffers violence and it seems, the violent bear it away. Perhaps those early believers resented being forced to move. Resentment can be a powerful drug, fueling all sorts of behavior, not all of it graced or even recognizably Christian. Resentment may cause one to dig in one's heel and resist the changes that are necessary. Evidently, the early believers did not resent the move, they simply moved and took with them their belief in the Word that had inspired them to become followers of the Risen Christ.

The members of the early church had to change to meet the demands of their days. Knowledge and understanding of who Jesus is and what claims He makes upon them grew. From the earliest writings of Sacred Scripture (St. Paul) to the theological developments in the succeeding Councils of the Church (in particular the ancient Councils of Nicea and Ephesus and the modern council, Vatican II) the followers of Jesus had to wrestle with His identity and presence in their lives and what that meant to them in how to live their lives. The same is true of us.

It is the greatest of ironies (and I rarely use the superlative mood) that the only constant in life is change. Our society is changing, our Church – both universal and local – is changing, our parish is changing. I have been pastor here for just under two years. Some parishioners lament that the place isn't what it used to be. The Masses were standing room only, I'm told; couldn't get a seat. I learned a long time ago that it is never a wise move to look for success in numbers. Remember Jesus said: Feed my sheep. He never told us to count them.

As we close in on the end of the Easter season, we can ask ourselves, in light of the changes the early Church went through, how are we going to handle the necessary changes in which we are involved. It is not a rhetorical question and I do not pose it as idle speculation. Part of my response as pastor is to organize a parish wide Synod Meeting in the fall of this year. This will be a one-day lengthy meeting to which all parishioners will be invited to engage in prayer and dialogue about the future of our parish. I already know what the parish should look like; the parish should look like the Kingdom of God. The multifaceted question is how to achieve that?

Members of the Parish Pastoral Council recently engaged in a session in which the effort to hold a Parish Wide Synod was presented to them. They responded enthusiastically. When the presenters had finished, I asked the Council members for their thoughts. Among the most telling of statements was: "We need this."

Watch this space for further details on the Parish Wide Synod to be held in the fall of this year. To quote Teresa of Avila: *Nada te turbe, nada te turbe* (Let nothing disturb you) All things change. Only God remains. The call we have received is this: Remain with Him.

I think it is hard for some families to make ends meet. Because of sickness or lack of education, some people can't get out and work. By the end of the month there are emergencies, so the food bank here at St. Helena's is supposed to fill that gap to help make things stretch. Our population is pretty diverse. There are a lot of seniors who utilize the food bank because they are caregivers for their grandchildren. I'm a nurse, so the food bank involves a sense of nutrition. Food can mean health, so we usually encourage the attendees when they are selecting food to be careful of their health needs. As a nurse, it's important for me to incorporate nutrition information and to not only give food to these people, but to feed their minds and encourage them to do better for themselves. I know Catholic Charities does a multitude of things. But feeding people is one of the most important and basic things. It gives parents and grandparents a sense of dignity to be able to provide for their family. There's nothing worse than having someone in your family that wants something to eat and you're not able to provide for them. So I think the CCA feeding people is important, not only physically, but emotionally and spiritually. Because when people gather around and share a prepared meal, something amazing happens. We're a beacon of hope for these people.
