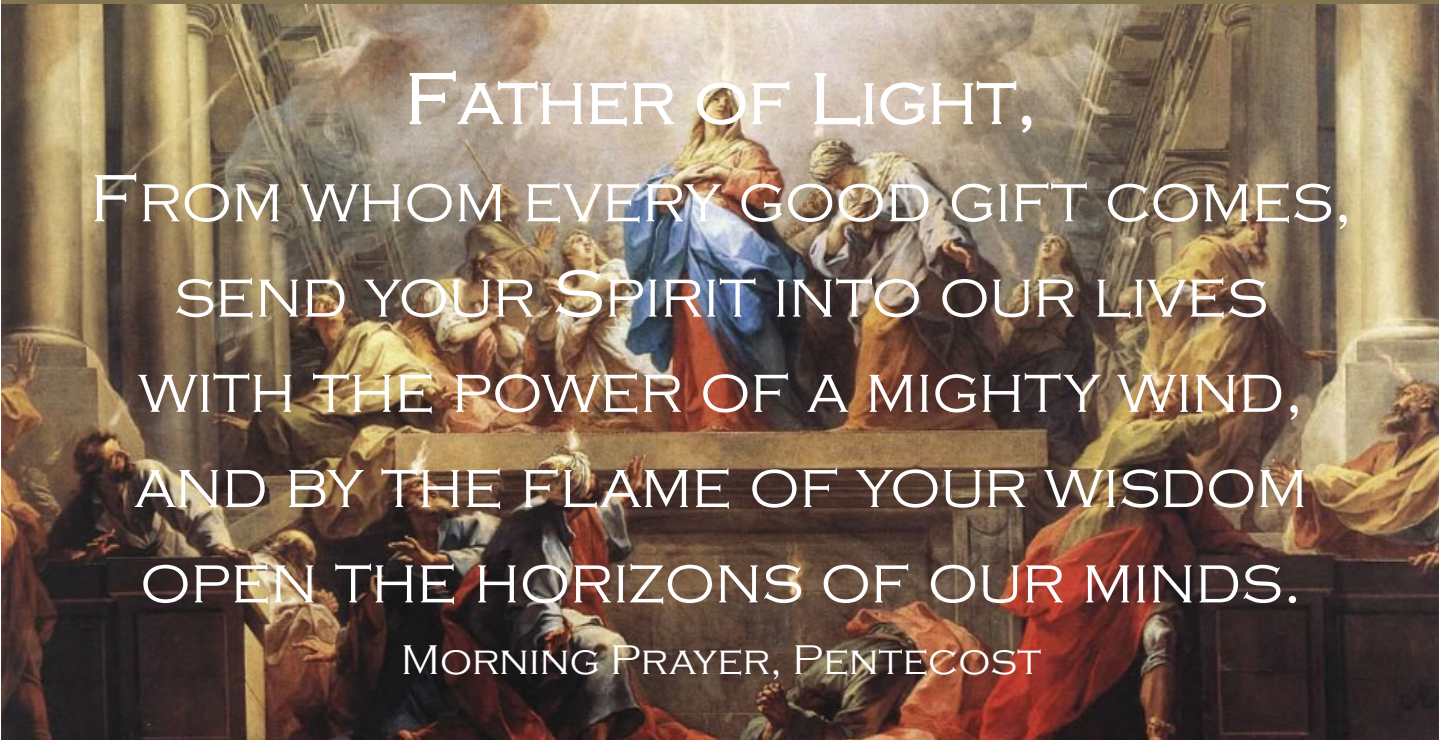

Thoughts from the Second Floor Front

Pentecost Sunday

June 9, 2019

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

When I was a student, I would try to remember to say that prayer before I took an exam. When I became of teacher, I said that prayer every time I gave an exam. Asking for the Spirit's assistance when engaging a test, I thought, was a good strategy; it was for the Spirit of Wisdom that I was searching. I also invoked St. Thomas Aquinas frequently; most of the material we studied came from him in one way or another. I figured Aquinas got me into this situation, I think it only fair that he help me out.

Today we celebrate the day the members of the early church were filled with the Holy Spirit. Hiding away in a sort of holy fear, the original band of 12 and certainly others, were locked and out of sight in that room, not certain of the future, not knowing what would happen next and not at all confident of their own abilities to meet the challenge. Perhaps, you've had that same sense at some time; I know I have. Then the Spirit exploded in their hearts and minds. Timid people, frightened by the world around them, suddenly became empowered and emboldened to speak the Good News to the world. They spoke the Kerygma, the original message – *Christ has died, Christ has risen, Christ will come again* – to all within earshot. The question has always been: was the miracle in the speaking or in the hearing? No matter the locus of the miracle, the wonder happened and those people initially cowering in fear became fear-less.

The true wonder is what happened after they began to preach. Simple and for the most part uneducated, the early disciples were able to transform their world. How is it possible that from this small beginning such a great enterprise as the Church grew throughout the centuries? In his detective series detailing the career of Sherlock Holmes, Arthur Conan Doyle wrote through the voice of the master detective: *when you have eliminated the impossible, whatever remains, however improbable, must be the truth*. On their own, it would have been impossible for this small band of believers, beginning in an obscure corner of the Roman empire, to transform the entire known world by their own words. With the Spirit of God working through them, they accomplished great things. The presence and activity of the Divine in and through the Church, can be the only reason that the Word spread. Its leadership throughout the history of the church (and now in our own day) has been flawed, fragile and futile and yet still the Church exists.

Beginning on that Pentecost Day in ancient Jerusalem up to an including this Pentecost Day in modern Chadds Ford, the Spirit of God is at work in and through believers. God may not be asking you to go into the streets and preach as the earliest disciples did. God is however, directing us to live in a manner consistent with the Spirit's presence within us.

The trial and tests that we take now are a wee bit more serious than a final exam in Medieval Philosophy. Reflect on those trials in your own life. Realize that we are not called to the hidden and self-imposed exile of hiding away in fear, as did the early disciples before the Spirit empowered them. We were sealed with the Spirit at our Baptism. We received the gifts of the Spirit at our Confirmation. In the days of this upcoming week, responding to the promptings and power of the Spirit we once again commit ourselves to living the gospel that inspired the early believers: a life based on gratuitous love, mutual forgiveness, the willingness to make the needs of others our own agenda and the dedication to awaken to each new day with the desire to make the world better; to fashion it into His Kingdom. With the power of the Spirit of God, all of that is possible

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, Through Christ Our Lord, Amen.

I've been at Villa St. Joseph for almost two years. I came here after I had a heart attack in the rectory and I happened to be alone that night. In the midst of the heart attack, I fell and broke my back. That set off a long series of surgeries and recovery. I needed a safe place to recover from these serious injuries and found myself here at the Villa.

There are about 50 priests here, of many years of experience, from many diverse ministries, and that has been very enriching to me. Some of them I knew as friends in the seminary, and some I've made as new friends. I've come to feel it's a true community and my real home now.

The care here is tremendous. Without the Villa, I would have been hard-pressed to find a place that would provide an atmosphere of secure care, physical care and the spiritual element of prayer that a priest is accustomed to – Mass every day, liturgy of the hours and a chapel for visiting.

All of my life, especially in key periods of a priest's, I've worked closely with the Catholic Charities Appeal on the giving end of their services. I never realized I'd be on the other end of that equation; I never realized that people would be taking care of me. We are directly taken care of by the good people of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, and that's a humbling feeling, but also spiritually enriching. Because we realize that people we have preached to are now practicing the charity that we encouraged, it's come full circle. We're full of gratitude for the people of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

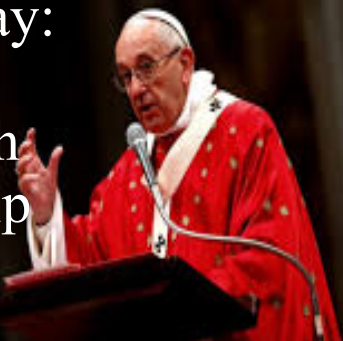
