Thoughts from the Second Floor Front XIV Sunday in Ordinary Time

July 7, 2019

The pithy, somewhat whimsical signs that are sometimes seen on the front of churches or on their lawns are eye catching and, in a unique sort of way, thought provoking. While they often strike me as a kind of bumper sticker theology, the signs make a point that commuters, drivers or passengers read the slogan as the car zips by at a clip. On a recent trip to Cape May I passed one such sign which subtly questioned: *Longstanding troubles? Try kneeling!* Among the most memorable was one I saw in the American South. I was in Mississippi on vacation with some priests friends years ago and passing a local church I read this sign barking out to passersby: *Honk if you love Jesus. Text if you want to meet Him!* Not much room for misunderstanding there.

The pressing nature of the message of the gospel takes on a new dimension in the proclamation from St. Luke this week as the mission to preach is extended beyond the twelve, the Apostles, and given to the seventy-two, the Disciples of Jesus. The admonition they receive indicates that their work is to depend on Jesus alone. In John's account, which we heard a few weeks ago on the feast of Pentecost, the mission given to the disciples is very broadly defined in Jesus' word to them: *Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them*... Not so in Luke's description of the commissioning, Jesus' directions are very specific:

Go on your way... Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way.

Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household...

Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you,

... Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town

you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you,

cure the sick in it and say to them, The kingdom of God is at hand for you.

That last sentence is the essential difference between the preaching of John the Baptist and Jesus' preaching. John said that the *Kingdom was coming*. Jesus announced that the *Kingdom is here*.

If it is here, why do we have such difficulty in recognizing it? What expectations skew our ability to perceive the Grace available to us and slant our vision? Too busy? Too preoccupied? Too settled and set in our attitudes and arrogances to perceive the possibility of something different? All things change. Why is the one immovable point in the universe our mindset. I had a Scripture prof who once asked of a classmate (And I am still thankful his withering gaze and interrogative was not put to me): Can you entertain the possibility that you are wrong?

Can you entertain the possibility that God is working in your midst in a way that does not fit in with your expectations? The Seventy-two seemed surprised if not rather shocked at the result of their own preaching, as we hear at the end of this passage. Yet God worked through them to achieve healing and freedom and peace for those to whom they preached the word. In approaching the tasks involved in establishing the Kingdom a certain level of docility and collaboration is necessary for every disciple.

Jesus' instruction for them to clap the dust of the streets from their feet from those towns that do not accept the message, or the messenger, need not be seen as the final and total condemnation of the town. Perhaps the message is that this particular messenger at this particular time is not the one to carry the Word to them. Perhaps it will be someone else. Perhaps it will be you.

The disciples rejoiced when they returned with their reports. Jesus' admonition to them can be addressed to us as well. Do not rejoice in what we often mistake as success brought about by our achievement, our efforts. Rather, rejoice because of the relationship we have with the Lord who calls us to be and empowers us to live and act as his disciples.


The Saint Monica Eldercare Program provides care and guidance to parishioners who have enriched the


