Thoughts from the Second Floor Front

XXXI Sunday in Ordinary Time

November 3, 2019

As we approach the closing days of this liturgical year, Advent being only three short weeks away, the readings in the liturgy of the Word have a tendency to reflect on the end of days. That is among the topics of St. Paul's letters to the Church in Thessalonica. Paul, along with his travelling companions and fellow missionaries, Silvanus and Timothy, arrive in the year 50 AD during their second missionary journey. Characteristically they begin preaching in a local synagogue. Also characteristically there is not a lot of success among the Jewish population of that ancient but cosmopolitan city in the Roman Empire. The Gentiles of the community manifest more openness to what Paul has to offer. After establishing the community in Thessalonica, Paul moves on to Athens and then to Corinth. For some unknown reason Paul is unable to return to Thessalonica and decides to send Timothy to gather some reliable information concerning disturbing news that he had received. The vibrant community of believers was suffering through persecution and when some among them announced that this was the end of the world, the end of time, it seems some began to believe that the end was near. Then Paul's letter arrives. That is the section we hear this weekend in the second reading of the Liturgy of the Word.

Paul's concern for the believers in that ancient city was well founded because many were being led away from the path of true faith and gospel teachings because they could not read the signs of the time in which they lived. Unless we are watchful and learn on our way, we can misread the signs. Years ago, I was visiting with friends in Ireland, in a remote section of County Donegal. I was asked to go on an errand and pick up the salmon that had been ordered for dinner. It was to be a poached salmon. I am still not certain if the descriptor for the salmon referred to its preparation or the manner by which it came into my possession; language can be tricky. It is a small village and the directions were fairly straightforward. There as only one road in and out of the town. Fairly straightforward you would think. The town itself was known by at least three names: Dunree or Muineagh or Desertegney. I was told to drive through town and go right at the first turning past Clark's Store. "*You know where that is don't you David? It the store with the sign that says Sullivan's.*" I was to take a right after passing Clarks, which is named Sullivan's. Only the Irish. Despite my ability to get lost in a revolving door I found the place, got the fish and had the dinner. If I had not listened to my friend's directions and been paying attention to the signs, as convoluted as they were, I would not have been able to find my way.

This brings us back to Thessalonica. The primary doctrinal value of St. Paul's letters to the Thessalonians lies in their eschatological teaching, their teaching about the end times. Paul encourages them to be steadfast, be faithful and remain true to what they have learned. Earlier this month we heard from the pastoral letter of Paul to Timothy when he wrote:

I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingly power: proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching. For the time will come when people will not tolerate sound doctrine but, following their own desires and insatiable curiosity, will accumulate teachers.

(II Tim 4:1-3)

There are a lot of signs in our culture, a lot of voices that tickle our ears, leading us away from the truth of the Gospel. If we go along with them unwittingly, we will find our selves adrift without a grasp on something solid. When you are challenged about your adherence to our Catholic faith, do people ever ask you: Why follow all those rules? Why not just go with the flow? Suggest to the questioner to go down to the Brandywine River and look at what is going with the flow. Dead things are going with the flow. Anything that is alive is swimming against the tide.

It may be easier to go with the flow, but it is not nearly as rewarding as being steadfast, certain and solid in your commitment to the faith that calls to you.

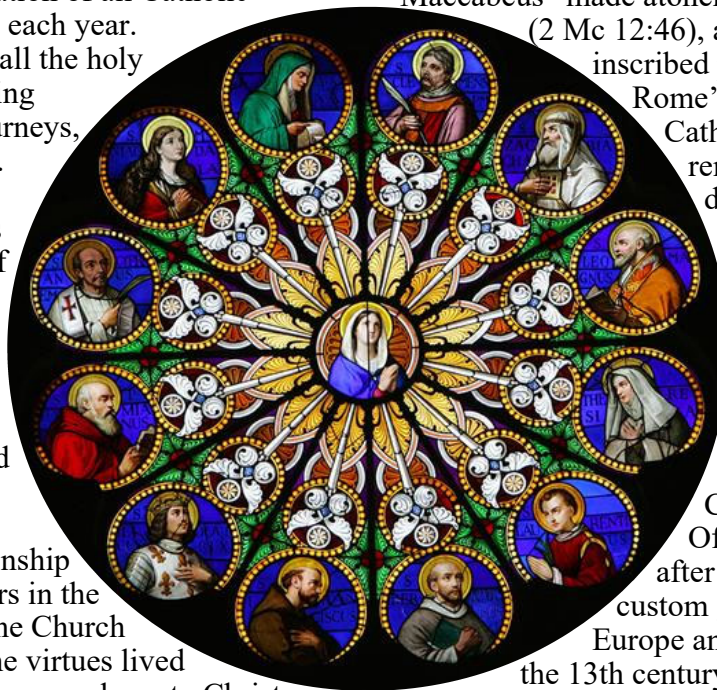


Solemnity of All Saints

**THE SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS
NOVEMBER 1 ♦ IS A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION.**

All Hallows' Day, the Solemnity of All Saints, or All Saints' Day is a celebration of all Catholic saints held on November 1 each year. "On this solemnity, we recall the holy men and women who, having completed their earthly journeys, now live forever with God. These saints, though not canonized, offer us models of abiding faith and love of God and neighbor" (Essential Guide to Seasons and Saints, 109).

Veneration of the saints fosters our faith in God and does not detract from it. Rather, our faith in God is strengthened by our relationship with our brothers and sisters in the faith who are in heaven. The Church teaches that by imitating the virtues lived by the saints, the saints brings us closer to Christ. When we ask the saints to pray for us, we ask them to join their wills with the will of God and intercede for us here on earth. This is the Communion of Saints which we profess every Sunday in the Creed.

NOVEMBER 2 ♦ COMMEMORATION

Prayers for the dead were an ancient tradition, even in some pagan cultures. In Jewish Scriptures, Judas Maccabeus "made atonement for the dead" (2 Mc 12:46), and early Christians inscribed prayers for their dead in Rome's catacombs. Local Catholic churches started remembering all the faithful departed in the early Middle Ages, with a Spanish feast from the time of St. Isidore of Seville, who died in 636. The fixed November date is generally attributed to St. Odilio of Cluny, who decreed in 998 that all monasteries under the Cluny rule should sing the Office of the Dead the day after the feast of All Saints. This custom gradually spread throughout Europe and was adopted by Rome in the 13th century.

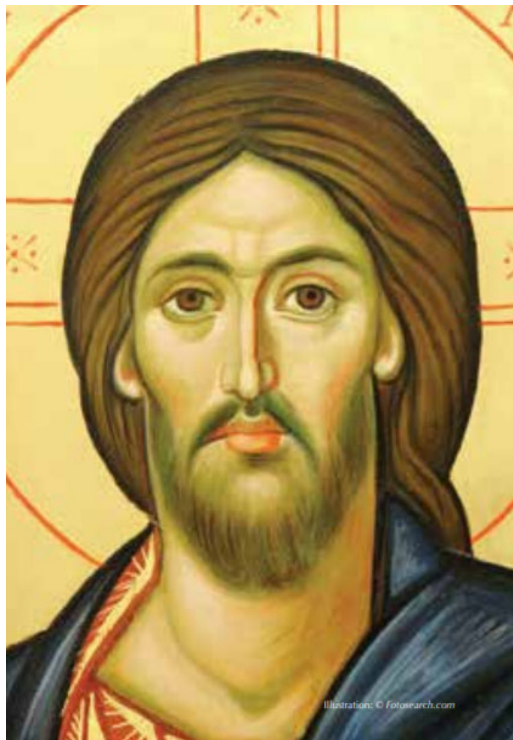
